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Preparation of manuscripts should be in accord with the latest issue of the most recent *CBE Style Manual*. Authors are encouraged to have at least two colleagues critically review their manuscript, before submission to **MICOLOGIA APLICADA INTERNACIONAL**. Manuscripts should be submitted along with an official letter from all authors stating a common consent for publication, and that the manuscript has not been sent for publication elsewhere simultaneously. Manuscripts received will be subjected to a blind-review process.
